Friday Morning Bible Study

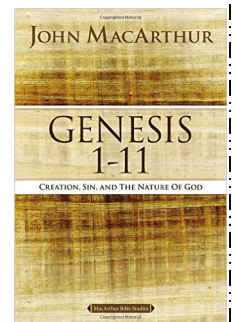
Creation, Sin, and the Nature of God *A Study of Genesis 1-11*

Where did we come from? Why is there pain in the world? Who committed the first murder? Why are there so many languages in the world? The first eleven chapters of the book of Genesis have the answers to these questions and more--providing us with the history of the human race in its earliest years prior to the time of Abraham.

Based on a book by pastor-teacher John MacArthur, this 11-week Bible study will be an in-depth look at the creation story, the first murder, Noah and the flood, the first covenant, the Tower of Babel, and the dispersion of the Nations. It will include close-up examinations of Adam, Eve, Cain, Abel, and Noah, as well as careful consideration of key doctrinal themes, such as "The Fall of Man" and "Heritage and Family."

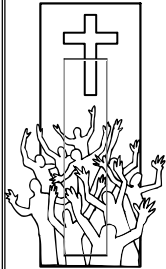

Anglicanism 101 : The Structure of Communion Part 2: The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The transition now complete, the Liturgy of Holy Communion begins with the Offertory, in which God's people offer Him their very selves, symbolized by the bread, wine, and money as the fruits of human labour.

Anaphora: Then comes the Great Thanksgiving to God, in which, at the phrase "lift up your hearts" (the sursum corda), as the Church itself is lifted up, as an offering, into the heavenly sanctuary.

Along with the angels in heaven, the Church praises God for His holiness in the Sanctus ("Holy, Holy, Holy"; Isa 6:3; Rev 4:8), and welcomes Christ's presence in the Eucharist through the Benedictus qui venit ("Blessed is he who comes"; Ps 118:26; Matt 21:9; 23:39).

Anamnesis: The redemptive acts of God, which enable the anaphora, are remembered throughout the Prayer of Consecration, culminating in the Words of Institution, in which the celebrant remembers and re-presents Christ's words at the Last Supper (Matt 26:26-28); "Take and eat...Drink this all of you..."

The Church then proclaims the great mystery which it is in the process of enacting: a celebration of Christ's resurrection after his death and before his second coming.

Epiclesis: The celebrant then offers the gifts of bread and wine to God, and invokes the Holy Spirit to sanctify both the gifts and the people—that they may rightfully receive the Sacrament in anticipation of God's coming kingdom—a kingdom which is the focus of the subsequent Lord's Prayer (Matt 6:9-13).

The celebrant then breaks the bread, declares Christ's redemptive role as the Church's Passover (Exod 12; 1 Cor 5:7b), and invites the people to partake of his Body and Blood; "The Gifts of God for the People of God."
