Creation, Sin, and the Nature of God A Study of Genesis 1-11



What is Anglicanism?

The word "Anglican" means "English" or "of England". It is rarely used to describe anything besides the Anglican Church. Anglicanism is a tradition within Christianity comprising the Church of England and churches which are historically tied to it or hold similar beliefs, worship practices, and church structures. Anglicans are Christians shaped by the English Reformation of the 16th century, as well as the theology and worship of the Church of England. There are currently 38 autonomous Anglican member churches, or provinces, of the Anglican Communion-which spans 164 countries with 77 million members. Anglicans represent many ethnic and cultural heritages. A shared form of worship, called common prayer, is used by Anglicans to provide a structure, or liturgy, for worship, prayer, and the administration of the sacraments. The various Books of Common Prayer give expression to a comprehensiveness found within the churches, which seek to chart a via media, or middle way, in relation to Catholic and Protestant Christian traditions. Anglicanism at is best is God Focussed, Bible based, and Spirit led.
