Friday Morning Bible Study

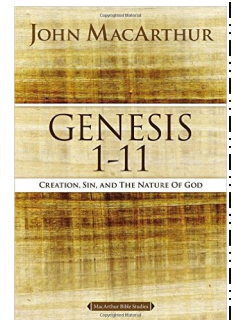
Creation, Sin, and the Nature of God *A Study of Genesis 1-11*

Where did we come from? Why is there pain in the world? Who committed the first murder? Why are there so many languages in the world? The first eleven chapters of the book of Genesis have the answers to these questions and more--providing us with the history of the human race in its earliest years prior to the time of Abraham.

Based on a book by pastor-teacher John MacArthur, this 11-week Bible study will be an in-depth look at the creation story, the first murder, Noah and the flood, the first covenant, the Tower of Babel, and the dispersion of the Nations. It will include close-up examinations of Adam, Eve, Cain, Abel, and Noah, as well as careful consideration of key doctrinal themes, such as "The Fall of Man" and "Heritage and Family."

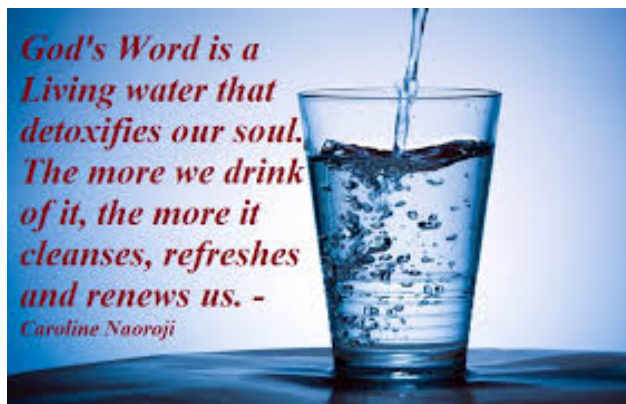


Life Groups at Living Waters

Anglicanism 101



Global Anglican Future Conference

The GAFCON movement is a global family of authentic Anglicans standing together to retain and restore the Bible to the heart of the Anglican Communion. Their mission is to guard the unchanging, transforming Gospel of Jesus Christ and to proclaim Him to the world. GAFCON is founded on the Bible, bound together by the Jerusalem Statement and Declaration of 2008, and led by a Primates Council which represents the majority of the world's Anglicans. GAFCON began in June 2008, when over 1000 Anglicans from 25 nations, including 288 bishops and representing more than 35 million practicing Anglicans worldwide, met in Jerusalem, for Bible teaching, worship and fellowship--as a principled response to the crisis in the Communion around the authority of Scripture in the church and human sexuality. At this Conference, delegates issued the **Jerusalem Declaration** (available on our website), that charts the way forward and promotes and protects the biblical gospel and mission to the world, solemnly declaring the tenets of orthodoxy which underpin our Anglican identity. GAFCON also initiated the call for a new Anglican Province to be established in North America to unite Biblically-faithful Anglicans--the **Anglican Church in North America (ACNA)**--of which ANiC was a founding Diocese.
