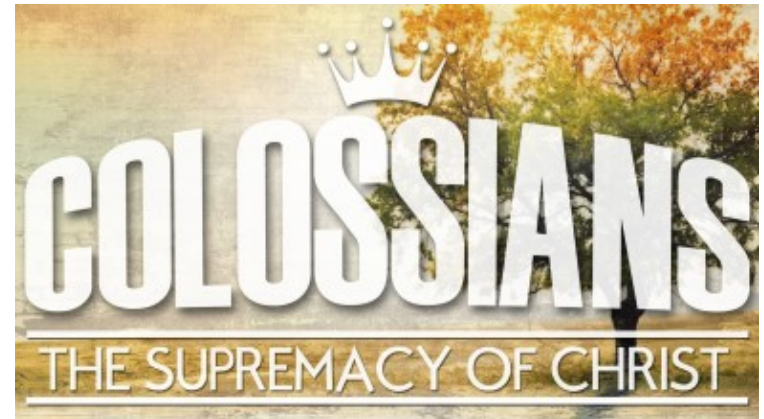

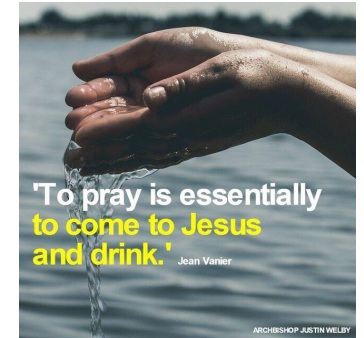

KIDZ ZONE & Teen Cafe



The Book of Acts tells us that when the church was first established there were no buildings--people met in the temple and synagogues for their corporate gatherings on the Lord's Day and in homes throughout the week. These groups were small enough to allow individual members to minister to one another, discover and use their spiritual gifts, and be disciplined in the teachings of Jesus.

Life Groups at Living Waters are small groups that provide an opportunity for connection, community, and spiritual transformation.
