Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The above words form the Book of Psalms remind us that thanksgiving lies at the heart of the Christian life and witness. It is a way of living that recognizes that everything we are and everything we have comes from God. In order to share in the Psalmist's words of praise and thanksgiving, we need to intentionally reflect on God's faithfulness and love to us—and to "count our blessings," as the expression goes, each and every day. God has blessed us and our faith community in many ways, and we have much to be thankful for at *Living Waters* in our first year together! Being thankful, however, involves far more than just recognizing God's faithfulness—it requires our response. We do this by seeking to be like Him, and by sharing our time, talents, and treasures with those around us. As followers of Jesus, we are called to share in His ministry by sharing with others all that we have received. This is not done out of duty, but rather out of love. Like the early Church described in the Book of Acts, Christ compels us to look outside of ourselves and our own needs and desires, to the needs and desires of others. Having experienced God's love and compassion in tangible ways, we have no choice but to share it with others in equally tangible ways.

I would like to invite you to share in God's graciousness by once again making an **intentional** commitment to support the work and ministry of God through *Living Waters*. In making this commitment, we live out our baptismal promises to: "proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ; to seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbour as our self; and to strive for justice and peace among all people, respecting the dignity of every human being." This is what Jesus' ministry was all about, and this is what we are all about, as individuals and as a faith community.

All ministry information will be given to Kathleen Young, our Vestry Clerk, who will ensure that you are contacted by the appropriate person for any new ministries that you are interested in undertaking. The financial information that you provide will be kept in strict confidence, and will help guide Parish Council as they prepare the 2017 Operating Budget. Please place your completed Commitment Card in the envelope provided. I invite you to offer your commitment to God on **Commitment Sunday–Sunday, October 30**<sup>th</sup>. If you are unable to be present on the 30<sup>th</sup>, please return your Commitment Card as soon as possible.

I have also included with this package an application for our Pre-Authorized Giving Program, which outlines the benefits of this program for both you and the parish. As a matter of convenience, you may find it helpful to have your financial offering automatically debited from your bank account. Pre-authorized debit has been a blessing to our ministry, especially over the summer months when attendance is sporadic and income is low. If you would like to participate in this programme, please return your completed form with a void cheque.

Fall is traditionally a time to give thanks. I give thanks for all of you, and for your thoughtful generosity and active support of the life and ministry of *Living Waters* over the past year. We have all been richly blessed and I am confident that God has great things in store for us in the coming year! I look forward to ministering with you with a renewed sense of compassion, commitment, and purpose.
