Take the 401 east to Highway 38 exit Travel north on Hwy 38 to Godfrey, ON Follow Westport Rd. east to the flashing light at Fermoy Turn north on Lee Rd. Travel 0.5 km and turn right on Iawah Rd. Follow the signs 3 km to Camp Iawah
