He wanted to assure them of his love, to praise them for their faithfulness in the face of persecution, and to remind them of their hope—the sure return of their Lord. Until that day, Paul challenges them to live lives pleasing to the Lord, more and more.

Directions to Camp Iawah

Camp Iawah is located 1 hour north of Kingston. Please note that GPS and web-based mapping programs are unavailable in much of rural Eastern Ontario. Please use the following directions and plan to use a proper map to stay on track!

Driving Directions from Kingston:

Take the 401 east to Highway 38 exit
Travel north on Hwy 38 to Godfrey, ON
Follow Westport Rd. east to the flashing light at Fermoy
Turn north on Lee Rd.
Travel 0.5 km and turn right on Iawah Rd.
Follow the signs 3 km to Camp Iawah
