I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, <u>for you are still of the flesh</u>. For <u>as long as there is jealousy and</u> <u>quarrelling among you, are you not of the flesh</u>, and behaving according to human inclinations?" (1 Corinthians 3:1-13) "Don't forget that you Gentiles used to be <u>outsiders</u>. You were called '<u>uncircumcised heathens</u>' by the Jews, who were proud of their circumcision, even though it affected only their bodies and not their hearts. In those days you were living apart from Christ. You were <u>excluded</u> from <u>citizenship among the people of Israel</u>, and you <u>did not know the covenant</u> promises God had made to them. You <u>lived in this world without God</u> and <u>without hope</u>." (Ephesians 2:11-12)

"But now you have been <u>united with Christ Jesus</u>. Once you <u>were far away</u> from God, but <u>now you have been brought near to him through the blood</u> of Christ." (Ephesians 2:13)

# **2 KINDS OF UNITY IN CHRIST**

#### #1. In Christ we have unity with \_\_\_\_\_

"For <u>Christ himself has brought peace</u> to us. <u>He united Jews and Gentiles</u> into one people when, in his own body on the cross, he <u>broke down the wall</u> <u>of hostility that separated us.</u> He did this by <u>ending the system of law with</u> <u>its commandments and regulations</u>. He made peace between Jews and Gentiles by <u>creating in himself one new people from the two groups</u>." (Ephesians 2:14-15)

Scripture is very clear: the only way we can have unity is through:

Jesus fulfilled the part of the Law that \_\_\_\_\_\_ Jews and Gentiles– He broke down the barriers that separated them. He abolished the hatred and enmity between them. And He brought them \_\_\_\_\_\_ by making them \_\_\_\_\_\_ in the church.

Has the blood of Jesus Christ been applied to your life? Has it broken down barriers between you and others?

#### #2. In Christ we have unity with \_\_\_\_\_

"Together as one body, Christ reconciled both groups to God by means of his death on the cross, and our hostility toward each other was put to death. He brought this Good News of peace to you Gentiles who were far away from him, and peace to the Jews who were near. <u>Now all of us can come to</u> the Father through the same Holy Spirit because of what Christ has done for us." (Ephesians 2:16-18)

God unifies us so that He can bring us to Himself and we in turn can bring \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Him-that's what church is all about.

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God-not the result of works, so that no one may boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9)

Any reason we can find to be hurt, bitter, or angry with each other is covered with \_\_\_\_\_.

When we are saved and baptized as a picture of that salvation, we are \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ with Christ. When this happens, certain things need to stay in the grave:

# **3 CHARACTERISTICS OF GOD'S FAMILY**
