Daniel and his friends shared three characteristics: their beauty and			
form; their prowess and ability; and their graces.			
They were the brightest and thehand picked by Nebuchadnezzar to serve in the Babylonian court. The King's plan was simple—he would them, thereby eliminating in their thinking their:			
They drew the line at the king's food. Their reason for this was simple: There was no mandate against the education or the the changing of their names. However, there was a clear biblical mandate against eating food.			
If they compromised thein their eating, they'd have easily compromised the Word of God in other areas, as well.			
Like Daniel, we need to draw the line where God draws it—on the basis of the of His Word.
