## The 7th Sunday of Easter ~ Sunday, May 13, 2018 "Hearing God ~ How God Speaks Part 4" 1 Samuel 3:1-10

"Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord before Eli. And word from the Lord was rare in those days, visions were infrequent. At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' and he said, 'Here I am!'" (1 Samuel 3:1)

When God is said to speak in the Bible, we can't always tell whether His voice is or "heard" by some other means.

God spoke to Samuel in such a way that he \_\_\_\_\_\_ heard his voice and thought it was calling him.

Throughout the Scriptures, God attaches tremendous \_\_\_\_\_\_\_to fasting, as the appointed way for His people to humble themselves before Him; and the Bible is filled with examples of godly men and women receiving \_\_\_\_\_\_ from the Lord as a result of fasting.

Fasting brings \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ to the Christian life. It's God's appointed way to bring our carnal nature into \_\_\_\_\_\_. "And <u>whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites</u>, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But <u>when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face</u>, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and <u>your Father who sees in secret will reward you</u>." (Matthew 6:16-18)
