He was so sure of it that he commanded them to carry his bones with them when they left." (Hebrews 11: 22)
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"But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—'I believed, and so I spoke'—we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that

the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence." (2 Corinthians 4:13-14)

Radical Faith says; "I choose to speak words of life and not death; and to believe that nothing is impossible for God." How do use your words?
