God has firmly established this law of sowing and reaping into His creation-both in the physical realm and in the ______ realm; and the ______ that we plant today (either physically or spiritually) will determine the kind of harvest that we'll reap in the future.

"Let the ground bring forth grass, and the herb yielding seed, and every fruit bearing tree bring forth fruit after its own kind. And it was so." (Genesis 1:1)

"<u>As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest</u>, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, <u>shall not cease</u>." (Genesis 8:22)

THE PRINCIPLE OF SOWING AND REAPING

"Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap <u>whatever you sow</u>." (v. 7)

heat of the moment, or out of our______-in reaction to someone or something

"If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh; but if you sow to the <u>Spirit</u>, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit." (v. 8)

We can either sow in the _____ or in the ______-we can either put good seeds into the soil or bad.

"The one who <u>sows sparingly will reap sparingly</u> and the one who <u>sows</u> <u>bountifully will also reap bountifully</u>... "He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and <u>multiply</u> your seed for sowing and <u>increase</u> the harvest of your righteousness." (2 Corinthians 9:6; 10)

Scripture also says that we'll reap_____than we sow.

"Still other seeds fell on fertile soil, and they produced a crop that was <u>thirty</u>, <u>sixty</u>, and even a hundred times as much as had been planted!" (Matthew 13:8)

When we sow bad seed in our lives, we're going to reap the same as we sowed and more. Whether it's anger, hatred, or bitterness, it will always come back to us in a _______measure.

"If you fully obey the Lord your God and carefully keep all his commands, the Lord your God will set you high above all the nations of the world. You will experience all these <u>blessings if you obey</u>. Your towns and your fields will be blessed. Your children and your crops will be blessed. The offspring of your herds and flocks will be blessed. Your fruit baskets and breadboards will be blessed. <u>Wherever you go and whatever you do, you will be blessed</u>." (Deuteronomy 28:1-6)

"The Kingdom of God is like a farmer who scatters seed on the ground. <u>Night</u> and day, while he's asleep or awake, the seed sprouts and grows, but he does not understand how it happens. The earth produces the crops on its own. First a leaf blade pushes through, then the heads of wheat are formed, and finally the grain ripens. And as soon as the grain is ready, The farmer comes and harvests it with a sickle, for the <u>harvest time has come</u>." (Mark 4:26-29)
