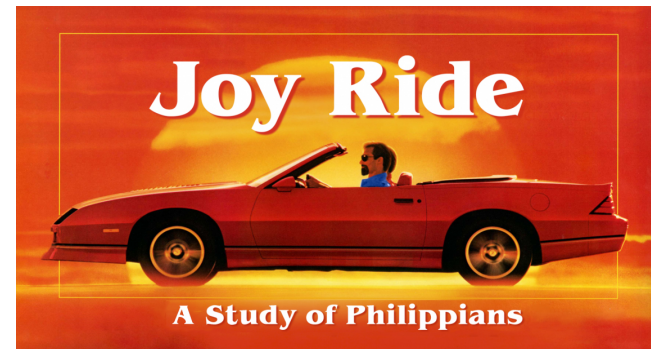

Faith Explored: Adult Sunday School

Join us Sunday morning's from 9:00 - 9:50 AM for four stand alone sessions led by Earl Briard, beginning **next Sunday, October 13.**

Week 1: The Three Imputations

Why and how am I affected by Adam's sin? Can penalties and righteousness be transferred? How are imputation and justification related? There are three imputations - or "reckonings" in Scripture that speak to these issues - and that resolve humanity's great problem!

Week 2: Four Alienations and The Fall

To be alienated is to be separated or estranged. The theme of the alienation of mankind has long been recognized. John Stott said: "nothing is more dehumanizing than this breakdown of fundamental human relationships." In what ways does this breakdown occur? What is the remedy? Can alienation be healed?

Week 3: A Prayer to Remember

Most of us pray spontaneously during our time of devotions. But have you ever written down your prayers? What may be some advantages of doing this? This session introduces us to two people who have done so.

Week 4: The Beauty of God

When we think of the attributes of God, His love, His goodness, His justice readily come to mind. But what of His aseity, simplicity, holiness, immutability, infinity - and many others? Someone has said: "God's beauty is the bouquet of His perfections..." Let's discuss!

Prayer Chain

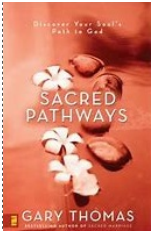

Sacred Pathways Book Study



"Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's spiritual walk." Are you envious of the way some people seem to walk closely with God, effortlessly spend hours in contemplative prayer? Maybe you're that way, but others are far better at showing God's love in practical ways or courageously standing up for God's Kingdom. Why can't you be more like them? The answer is simple: you weren't designed to be!

In his book, *Sacred Pathways*, Gary Thomas strips away the frustration of a one-size-fits-all spirituality and guides you toward a path of worship that frees you to be you. We all relate to God differently, and if our prayer life hits a snag, perhaps it's because we're trying to follow someone else's path. This book explodes the barriers that keep Christians locked into rigid methods of worship and praise, and describes 9 distinct spiritual temperaments: **Naturalists, Sensates, Traditionalists, Ascetics, Activists, Caregivers, Enthusiasts, Contemplatives, and Intellectuals**—their characteristics, strengths and pitfalls. Illustrated with examples from the Bible, each path describes an approach to loving God through a distinct journey of adoration.
