Our Core Values

We value many things at *Living Waters*; however, there are some things that are particularly important to us—we call them our **Core Values**. These core values are **guiding principles** that dictate our behaviour and actions; they reflect the kind of congregational **culture** that we value, the **spirit** in which we do things, and the way we **relate** to one another. They also act as **sign posts** as we move forward together. This week we focus on:

ANGLICANISM

Anglicanism is both ancient and reformed, and embraces the three streams of historic Christianity: Evangelical, Anglo-Catholic, and Charismatic. We value the earliest teachings of the Church consistent with Scripture, as expressed in the historic creeds. We also value the Protestant Reformation of the Church, when the Reformers sought to recover the clarity of the Gospel. As Anglicans, our lives are shaped by the Bible, the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the tradition of Common Prayer. In our worship life, we seek to embrace the best of the historic teaching and traditions of the Church while welcoming fresh expressions of the Holy Spirit in our midst.

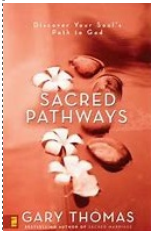


Prayer Chain

Sacred Pathways Book Study

“Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour’s spiritual walk.” Are you envious of the way some people seem to walk closely with God, effortlessly spend hours in contemplative prayer? Maybe you’re that way, but others are far better at showing God’s love in practical ways or courageously standing up for God’s Kingdom. Why can’t you be more like them? The answer is simple: you weren’t designed to be!

In his book, *Sacred Pathways*, Gary Thomas strips away the frustration of a one-size-fits-all spirituality and guides you toward a path of worship that frees you to be you. We all relate to God differently, and if our prayer life hits a snag, perhaps it’s because we’re trying to follow someone else’s path. This book explodes the barriers that keep Christians locked into rigid methods of worship and praise, and describes 9 distinct spiritual temperaments: **Naturalists, Sensates, Traditionalists, Ascetics, Activists, Caregivers, Enthusiasts, Contemplatives, and Intellectuals**—their characteristics, strengths and pitfalls. Illustrated with examples from the Bible, each path describes an approach to loving God through a distinct journey of adoration.

This Thursday, we will be looking at the Intellectual path.
