

Sacred Pathways Book Study

"Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's spiritual walk." Are you envious of the way some people seem to walk closely with God, effortlessly spend hours in contemplative prayer? Maybe you're that way, but others are far better at showing God's love in practical ways or courageously standing up for

God's Kingdom. Why can't you be more like them? The answer is simple: you weren't designed to be!

In his book, Sacred Pathways, Gary Thomas strips away the frustration of a one-size-fits-all-spirituality and guides you toward a path of worship that frees you to be you. We all relate to God differently, and if our prayer life hits a snag, perhaps it's because we're trying to follow someone else's path. This book explodes the barriers that keep Christians locked into rigid methods of worship and praise, and describes 9 distinct spiritual temperaments: Naturalists, Sensates, Traditionalists, Ascetics, Activists, Caregivers, Enthusiasts, Contemplatives, and Intellectuals—their characteristics, strengths and pitfalls. WELCOME TO OUR GUEST PREACHER

This morning we welcome Dr. Byron Wheaton and his wife Jackie to *Living Waters*. Byron was our retreat leader this weekend at Camp IAWAH, and spoke on the topic:

"Matter Matters: Being Disciples of Jesus in a 'Spiritual' World.."

Byron is a Bible teacher and disciple-maker. His passion is to teach God's word and to equip and mentor leadership for the church. He has served on several pastoral staffs in varying roles over twenty years of pastoral experience. In September 2013, he concluded seven years of ministry at Bay Park Baptist Church in Kingston, Ontario. He is currently providing pastoral leadership at the Kingston East End Community Church, a new Baptist church plant in Kingston.

Byron has been extensively involved with theological education, teaching in seminaries and Bible colleges in the USA, Singapore, Malaysia, and Canada. He serves as Professor of Pastoral Theology and the Old Testament at Ryle Seminary (ANiC) in Ottawa; adjunct professor of Old Testament at Emmanuel Bible College in Kitchener, Ontario; and adjunct professor at Heritage Bible College and Seminary in Cambridge, Ontario. He earned his PhD in Old Testament and Hermeneutics from Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Byron is the father of four adult children and lives with his wife, Jackie, in Kingston.
