### Reverse Advent Calendar Advent Outreach

The 3rd Sunday of Advent, or Gaudete Sunday, takes its name from the Latin word meaning "rejoice," the first word of the introit (introductory sentence) traditionally said or sung on this day; "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice..." (Phil 4:4-6). The liturgical colour pink symbolizes a break from the penitential nature of the season, signifying the nearness of the Lord's coming, which is a time of great joy!

The premise of the *Reverse Advent Calendar* is simple: Instead of getting something yourself, you give to someone else. This is a great way to look beyond ourselves this Advent and Christmas season and to help others who might be in need at a time of the year when resources often run short.
