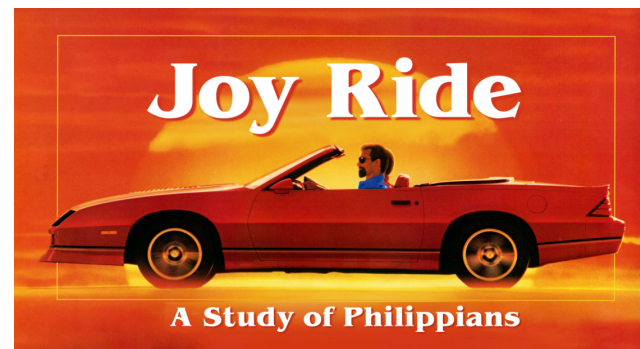

Our Core Values

We value many things at *Living Waters*; however, there are some things that are particularly important to us—we call them our **Core Values**. These core values are **guiding principles** that **dictate** our behaviour and actions; they **reflect** the kind of congregational **culture** that we value, the **spirit** in which we do things, and the way we **relate** to one another. They also act as **sign posts** as we move forward together. This week we focus on:

ANGLICANISM

Anglicanism is both ancient and reformed, and embraces the three streams of historic Christianity: Evangelical, Anglo-Catholic, and Charismatic. We value the earliest teachings of the Church consistent with Scripture, as expressed in the historic creeds. We also value the Protestant Reformation of the Church, when the Reformers sought to recover the clarity of the Gospel. As Anglicans, our lives are shaped by the Bible, the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the tradition of Common Prayer. In our worship life, we seek to embrace the best of the historic teaching and traditions of the Church while welcoming fresh expressions of the Holy Spirit in our midst.
