"Do not be alarmed. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. <u>He</u> is not here! <u>He is risen from the dead</u>!" (Mark 16:6)

The events of that first Easter-the resurrection of Jesus-form the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of our faith.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By His great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead..." (1 Peter 1:3)

At the very heart of Christianity-at the core of our faith-is \_\_\_\_\_.

"Let your unfailing love surround us, Lord, for <u>our hope is in you alone</u>." (Psalm 33:22)

Hope = *elpis* = " to hope; to anticipate with pleasure; to welcome; trust; ; and expectation of what is \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_.

"Hope is the <u>unshakable certainty</u> in the promises of God, based on <u>the life, death</u>, <u>and resurrection of Jesus.</u>"

This is what we celebrate this morning-the \_\_\_\_\_ hope that we have through the life-changing \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus' resurrection.

### THE LIVING HOPE OF THE RISEN JESUS
