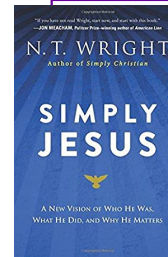

## *Simply Jesus* ZOOM DVD/Book Study

Tuesday evenings in Lent, beginning  
Tuesday, February 23, 2021  
7:00 PM - 8:30 PM

We have grown used to the battles over Jesus--whether He was human or divine, whether He could do miracles or just inspire them, whether He even existed. Much of the Church defends tradition, while critics take shots at the institution and its beliefs. But what if these debates have masked the real story of Jesus? What if even Jesus' defenders have been so blinded by their focus on defending the church's traditions that they have failed to grapple with what the New Testament really teaches?

New Testament Scholar and former Bishop of Durham, N. T. Wright, summarizes 200 years of modern Biblical scholarship and models how Christians can best retell the story of Jesus today. In a style similar to C. S. Lewis, Wright breaks down barriers that prevent Christians from fully engaging with the story of Jesus. For believers confronting the challenge of connecting with their faith today, Wright's *Simply Jesus* offers a provocative new picture of how to understand who Jesus was and how Christians should relate to Him today.

Participants will view each session together on Zoom and then discuss. If you wish to purchase the companion book, it is available on Amazon. The church has six copies for sale--first come first served! For more information, speak to Simon Teague.
