This offers each of us a cultural solution to our problems and our pain. It offers 'individual autonomy, 'dignity and 'control'. Yes, we are all vulnerable: our parishioners, our families, our friends, our neighbours, and our fellow Canadians!

We learned from Rev. Rick Bergh, (a priest, thanatologist, grief counsellor) that the tsunami of MAiD grief. is already being experienced by an increasing number of individuals: the 'patient', their caregivers, families and the wider community. The 'wake' of this 'autonomous' choice affects many. In his booklet 'Shepherding the Dying', Rev. Rick shares with us practical ways and means to shepherd and pastor our congregations and the wider community during such difficult situations.

"... the doors being shut for fear of the Jews came Jesus and stood among them and said, "Peace be unto you." Fear is a biological implant, preparing us for defensive action when our life is threatened. To preserve our life, depending on what species we are, we will stand still, change colour, flee or aggressively attack (there are others!).

Unfortunately for the human species too often fear simply means impotent paralysis, serving no life preserving purpose at all. We passively wait for Whatever It Is to devour us! This was certainly the situation of the disciples on Easter Day, they were overwhelmed by the death of Jesus and, unlike the women, took no action whatsoever. Sadly this is not unlike the situation of many Christians today. Be it COVID Isolation, actions by the state, or social conventions, we just hunker down and wait for Our Fate.

But the risen Jesus, as He did with the disciples, stands among us and says, "Peace," which means Well Being, Courage, All is Well! And as He did with the disciples, He breathes upon us, and the Rest Is History! And as Scripture says, "then were the disciples glad when they saw the Lord," and the world changed as a result.

As I said, we certainly have reason to be overwhelmed by events we thought impossible a generation ago or even a year ago. Certainly in the area of Life Issues abortion or euthanasia seems the only way out for some frightened people. They accept death as the solution.

But Jesus, not death, is the Saviour. He by the power of the Holy Spirit changes us, preserves and enhances human life and enables us to deal with and celebrate the true gift of life. So let us be of good cheer, keep the Faith, and encourage the faint-hearted.

We at AFLC have some programmes to help keep Fear at bay, and we commend them to your attention, particularly at this time. Christians with the courage and purpose of the Risen Christ are the antidote for this time, and no waiting is necessary!







A Young Couple's Message to ANIC's Young People "Why Should Young People Be Life-Affirming?"

What does it mean to be pro-life? Does it mean imposing our preference for birth upon pregnant women—many of whom are our peers—with no concern for what they want? Concerning the issue of euthanasia and MAiD, is being pro-life about forcing dying people to continue suffering? Many in our society seem to think so, but these descriptions are slanted and miss the bigger picture. The heart of the pro-life position is not the denial of anything, but the affirmation of the sanctity of all human life. Every single person is made in the image of God and has priceless value in him- or herself. Our value comes not from what we do, but who we are.

With this conviction:

- we fight against slavery and any notion that humans can be treated as property.
- we support health-care workers who help people live longer, healthier lives.
- we affirm that unborn babies and suffering people are genuine human beings whose lives cannot be ended because of anyone's free choice.

In a society where many secular people assume that any decent person is pro-choice, we might want to keep our pro-life views to ourselves. But real lives are affected, and action is needed. It is also important that we do not fall into the trap of thinking that nothing we do will help. There are many ways to help real people, and on the intellectual side, you might be surprised by the openness some of our peers have to civil conversations about life issues. Finally, do not be deceived by the stereotype of passionate pro-lifers as shouting, intolerant maniacs. Pro-life convictions can and should work themselves out in loving, gracious, and judicious ways, and being pro-life does not mean constantly bellowing your opinions from the rooftops. If you want to make a difference, speak with your rector about what you and other members of your parish can do.

For all who work to uphold the sanctity of human life, we pray to the Lord* Grant them Your Mercy


For those who work giving assistance to all those we have mentioned, we pray to the Lord* **Grant them Your Mercy**

 - critical personal information & financial data
 - signing a Power of Attorney or a Protective Medical Decisions Document
 - updating and signing a Will
 - discussing your end-of-life wishes and goals with family or valued friends
