4 LESSONS ABOUT OBEDIENCE FROM THE LIFE OF JOSEPH

Lesson #1. _____.

"When Joseph awoke from sleep, <u>he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him;</u> he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus." (Matthew 1:24)

"I will hasten and not delay to obey your commands." (Psalm 119:60)

"This is love for God: to obey his commands. And his commands are not burdensome." (John 5:3)

God's commands are only burdensome when we:

Lesson #2. _____.

"<u>But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son</u>. And he gave him the name Jesus." (Matthew 1:25)

"We are <u>pressed on every side</u> by troubles, but not crushed and broken. We are <u>perplexed because we don't know why</u> things happen as they do, but we don't give <u>up and quit</u>." (2 Corinthians 4:8)

When life doesn't make sense, we have two choices:

"For <u>my thoughts are not your thoughts</u>, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55:8)

Lesson #3. ______.

"When the wise men had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. 'Get up,' he said, 'take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him.' <u>So he got up,</u> took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod." (Matthew 2:13)

(Matthew 2:19)
