The 17th Sunday after Pentecost ~ Sunday, September 24, 2023 "Life in the Spirit: God Is For Us" **Romans 8:31-35**

"What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?"

(Romans 8:31-35)

Over and over again Paul stops to ask this question. And I suspect it's because it was an important part of his agenda that the conclusions that arise from his teaching would be clearly and embraced by his audience.

That's what all faithful and teaching should aim to do. It's not enough to simply the facts, outline doctrine, or reveal the truths contained in Scripture. We also need to ask the question-we need to it to our lives,

To put it another way, do you come to church as a consumer, or do you come rolling up your sleeves ready to get to work applying the message of the Scriptures to your own_____, with the deep conviction that in the preaching of God's Word, God is speaking to you?

There's a sense in which the four application questions that Paul asks here are like the cracking of the Enigma code, because they let us in on the enemy's , which is enormously helpful as we seek to successfully engage in the spiritual that's all around us.

This should tip us off to the at play in this whole question of Christian assurance, which you'll remember is Paul's great concern in this chapter-for us to know and feel the reality of our _____ before God in Christ. And Paul knows that a significant part of our struggle with assurance and spiritual confidence has to do with personal, supernatural

We need to face the fact that behind our battles with assurance, spiritual confidence in the love of God for us, and so much else that we struggle with in our Christian lives, there is a at work in constant opposition to the design of God for us.

Scripture is clear that we have an , the devil, "who prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour," as we read in 1 Peter 5:8. He's our who seeks to assault us and bring us into condemnation and destruction.

The escalating scale in these four questions unmasks the enemy's fourfold strategy against us: ______.


