Adult Sunday School: 'The Anglican Collects

Tucker Carrington will be leading an Adult Sunday School series on the Collect Prayers in the Book of Common Prayer 2019, beginning next Sunday, January 21 at 9.00 AM.

A collect (such as the "Collect for Purity") is simply a prayer meant to gather the intentions of the people and the focus of worship into a succinct prayer. All of the collects in the BCP 2019 more or less fit the pattern that Archbishop Thomas Cranmer developed, and some would say, perfected in the first Book of Common Prayer (1549).

The form of collects is actually quite simple. First, there is an address to God and to his character or actions in the world on our behalf. Second, there is a request. Third, there is an invocation and doxology. Finally, there is The Amen.

Tucker's goal is that at every session participants' faith will be built up and hey will be reassured and challenged to understand the meaning and implication of the collect.
