INTRODUCTION

We live lives of such relativein our North American context, that we rarely think about heaven, and when we do, it really doesn't seem all that attractive a prospect. We prefer theof our material prosperity here rather than the hard to picture raptures of our heavenly home hereafter.		
It'll awaken in us a properfor the life to come. It'll form in us a renewed resolve to prepare for that life even while we live in this one. And it'll weaken our to the fleeting pleasures of this life as we begin to see how much sweeter are the "solid joys and lasting treasures none but Zion's children know" in the life that lies ahead of us,		
is the biblical antidote to worldliness.		
#1. Heaven will be a life of "One of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?" (Revelation 7:13)		
The "great tribulation" is often interpreted as being a special period of intense just before the final return of Christ.		
"I John, your brother and partner <u>in the tribulation and kingdom and patient endurance</u> that are in Christ Jesus." (Revelation 1:9)		
Those three things-tribulation, kingdom, and patient endurance-always go for those who are in Christ.		
The great tribulation, in other words, is a reference to the whole period between theandcoming of Jesus, viewed from the vantage point of the suffering Church.		
When John sees this vast multitude, he's talking about the whole

Although blood stains and ruins clothes, the blood of Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world can make even the foulest		
This is theof every citizen of heaven. They're robed in theof Christ, and are clean, pure, and holy. Their white robes are the symbol not merely of a legal righteousness, satisfying divine justice, but of a pervasive,holiness. They're pure all the way through.		
Of course, if we believe in Jesus, this is alreadytrue of us here and now. Right now in the sight of God, before the bar of heaven's justice, we're clean and righteous. Not because of anything we've done, but because we're robed with theof Christ.		
Yet, while we live in this world, there still remains so much of our oldin us. We may be legally, forensically righteous,in Jesus Christ before the judgment of God right now, but we're not yet made perfect intrinsically,, like those described in Revelation 7.		
We can be stubborn. We'reto our sin. We stumble and we fall. And our sin in this life is like heavy, iron shackles or chains constraining our wrists and our ankles.		
Our sanctification—our progress in holiness—isandin this life.		
However, the moment we die, the lastof sin will finally and fully fall away, and we'll beof its pollution, power, and presence.
