Therefore you shepherds, hear the word of the Lord, I am against the shepherds." (Ezekiel 34:2-7)

JESUS, OUR GOOD SHEPHERD
<b>#1. Jesus, our Good Shepherd,</b> His sheep. "I am the good shepherd, <u>I know my own and my own know me.</u> " (14-15)
"My sheep <u>hear my voice</u> and I know them." (27)
Thisknowledge of the shepherd for His sheep is important.  As Jesus' sheep, we are of great He loves us. He knows us. And He calls us by
Jesus knows us intimately because Heus. He knows everything about us—our problems and struggles, our strengths and weaknesses, our joys and sorrows. He knows ourbefore we think them, our words before we speak

them, and our actions before we do them. He knows our inner most thoughts and our darkest He knows everything about us. Nothing we do surprises Him, He knows us so well. In fact, He knows usthan we know ourselves.
