From the earliest of times, Jesus' saving work has been divided into three great events—the crucifixion: Christ died, the resurrection: God raised Him from the dead, and the ascension: He ascended to heaven. In the crucifixion, Jesus defeated the power of In His resurrection, He defeated the power of, taking His rightful place, and for ever at God's right hand.
"When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:9-11)
The resurrection of Jesus signalled the end of a chapter in Jesus' earthly life. It was essential then, that there should be a clear-cutto bring that chapter to a close.
There had to be a dividing day—when the Jesus of earth became the Christ of heaven. And so, the ascension was the only fitting to Jesus' earthly ministry.
This is most likely a reference to the Shekinah—the cloud of God's glory that hovered over Mount Sinai after the Exodus. The Shekinah exceeds in radiance any other cloud—it's the visible of God's radiant glory.
