3 UNDERSTANDINGS

"I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength." (Phil 4:13)
• "Jesus does it all and I do ."
"I work hard and struggle to do this while his mighty power works in me." (Colossians 1:29)
It's not about us, it's all about . However, we have an importan
role to play. By grace, we're with Christ, and He calls us to

work along side Him, using the strength and the gifts, talents, and abilities that Heus.		
"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruitAbide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." (John 15:1-4)
