Turning to the Mystics

On **Monday September 22 @ 7:00 PM**, interested parishioners are welcome to gather via Zoom for an informational evening about the podcast series "Turning to the Mystics," as presented by James Finley, an author and retired clinical psychologist with a lifelong passion for contemplative spirituality and specifically the mystics of Christian history. His presentations on St. John of the Cross, Teresa of Avila, Meister Eckhart and others are encouraging, grounding and full of wisdom for the spiritual journey today. In his youthful days, James spent time as a novice in the monastery studying directly under Thomas Merton, one of the great lights of the last century.

The intent is to gather weekly by Zoom for reflection upon a podcast, leaving time for the practice of stillness. The group will start with eight or so podcasts on the central writings of Thomas Merton and then move onward to another notable name of the Church. This group experience of turning to the mystics for guidance, builds upon the past year's reading and practice of Martin Laird's foundational material.

Of note, this podcast material may be a suitable resource for our young adults who likely find a regular Monday evening commitment challenging if not impossible but might have time in the week for a 45 min podcast, skipping the Zoom group.
