“Create in Me a Clean Heart” Book Study
Experience God’s Love, Personal Renewal, and Ultimate Joy

Psalm 51 is not a typical psalm of the Bible. It is the cry of someone who has been found out—and who finally stops defending himself. Then, knowing God’s great steadfast love and mercy, King David experiences God’s love, personal renewal, and ultimate joy.

For centuries, the Church has returned to this psalm during Lent because it tells the truth we would rather avoid: repentance is not about trying harder or offering more. It is about standing unprotected before God and trusting His mercy to reach what is real.

In *Create in Me a Clean Heart*, Anglican priest and pastor David Roseberry offers a slow, prayerful walk through Psalm 51. Its not about self-improvement, but a companion for those who are ready to tell the truth before God and discover the birthright of faith: love, renewal, and joy.

Participants are invited to read a brief section each day during the week and then gather on Sunday mornings at **9:00 AM** to discuss what they’ve been learning.

Psalms for the Journey: A Three-Session Lenten Bible Study

“Psalms for the Journey” is a three-session Bible study that invites us to walk through the season of Lent with the prayer book of Scripture. The Psalms give voice to the full range of human experience before God: honesty and repentance, longing and waiting, fear and trust. Rather than rushing us toward answers, they teach us how to pray truthfully in every season of life.

During these sessions, we’ll sit with three psalms that have guided God’s people for generations, allowing them to shape our prayers and deepen our attentiveness to God. This study isn’t about mastering content, but about creating space—space to listen, to reflect, and to bring our whole selves before God as we journey toward Holy Week and the celebration of Christ’s death and resurrection.
